



Nick Pardee Ramblings



Hello Classic MG Club members: Ohio's winter was snowy, icy, frozen, seriously frozen and muddy. The dark, red stiff-fingered, cold season was a time for reflection. I have been recollecting my lifelong connection with MGs and their drivers while looking at pictures of them. I found a dusty stack of K Mart quality processed (it said so on the paper) 6 x 8 prints amid the bits of car languishing for nearly forty years at a local restoration shop where Goldseal is subcontracting. The photographs depict the MG life of a man in his mid thirties during the Magnum P.I. shorts period of the 1980s. His car is a solid wheel TD. In the stack there are studies of shirtless friends investigating the underhood (a beer can resting on the radiator cap), a car show where the TD is parked next to a 1935 Dodge, an attractive woman in tortoise shell sunglasses and a sun hat behind the wheel and a group of kids standing on every part of the bodywork and interior except the hood having a great time. The photographs at the bottom of the stack, some stuck together or water damaged portend the TD's current state. They are carefully focused visual records of the disassembly. Many of the details painstakingly captured are of non-factory assemblies and parts, like the Ford starter solenoid standing in for the starter switch and the Studebaker master cylinder. This MG driver's name and the stories behind the stack of photographs are lost to time. The shop owner had never seen the stack. He said that the guy in the pictures is definitely not the guy that dropped off the boxes of TD in the nineties, though. The photographs without any context are interesting. However, they made me think of all the MG pictures that I have accumulated and inherited. As a result of thumbing through the stack, I have been organizing and captioning images of MGs and their drivers. "The guy in the pictures" lost memories have led me to revisit many of my fondest ones. I took the photo at the head of these ramblings with my phone out the window of an MGB GT in the third week of October last year. We are parked on the western shoulder of the slight hump before the climb up the steepest hill on Swigart Rd leaving Malabar Farm State Park at about five o'clock in the afternoon. This was the absolute last day for leaf peeping as a wind storm swept through the area that night and the next day downing the foliage.





This is a still from a GoPro video that I made of an MG trip from Clearwater to Richloam General Store, Yalaha Bakery and Sugarloaf Mountain in 2019. Shot from the rear window of the Y Type, Jeff Brown is exercising his father's TD while Ron Streicher holds on in the passenger seat. Jeff and his brother restored the TD long before. Upon his retirement to Florida, Jeff had the time to drive the TD frequently and enjoy a fine automobile. Jeff also drove a well known and fast TD in vintage races across the Northeast. Jeff died suddenly in October of 2019. I was fortunate to share some MG fun with him.



Amy Garvin nee Novak and I, still long distance friends and usually brought together by MGs, await the Marshall's call to the racetrack on the false grid for the prewar feature race at the Fall Festival in 2017. Lime Rock Park is the family's home track and the Fall Festival is a premier national vintage racing event. I may look more nonchalant than trackside support personnel should, however I have supreme confidence in our race car and its skillful seasoned capable driver. George Pardee



July of 2024 on county road 97 west of the Clear Fork Reservoir. The customer requested a two hundred mile shakedown before delivery of his TF 1500, a pleasant way to spend a Sunday afternoon with my best girl in the passenger seat. Prior to this drive, she had never ridden in an MG and had shown no particular interest in the prospect. Afterward, she is excited for summer 2025 and MG fun.



Dan Duran's completed XPAG build in 2017. If I remember correctly Dan is about to arrive with the car for installation and initialization. Dan selected the vivid Chrysler red engine paint. Both my mother, Elyn Pardee MG driver since she bought her Midget new, and I look slightly caught off guard. No excuse for the wonky eye glasses. Good thing they weren't progressive bifocals back then as someone might have been inadvertently injured. I am proud to have been a part of making Dan's TF into the fun reliable show winning car it is today



My brother Will and I in Tom Scott's MGA race car at Moroso Motorsports Park around 1986. Our father's TF 1500 is visible in the top right corner, spare wheel removed to reduce weight and add lightness. Tom's driver suit draped over the roll bar to dry and the pond like puddle in the background illustrate the prevailing climatic conditions that weekend. As a small child I was awed by the purposeful race drivers and their fast loud machines. Climbing on the bleacher supports, riding bikes in the paddock, playing in the mud and reading books on a picnic blanket took up most of my time at the track in those days. I still want to be a race car driver when I grow up.



Tom Metcalf world renowned MMM MG restorer and repository of otherwise forgotten knowledge in his works coveralls, Robert Carr historic/military re-enacting MG driver and I on the show field at The Amelia Island Concours in 2022 with Robert's J2. Freshly restored at Tom's Safety Fast! Restorations, the car completed the over sixty mile Eight flags tour. Robert and the J2 were awarded the Sandra Alford Fashion Trophy for Robert's portrayal of an Englishman in the tropics with his car in 1933 down to the period correct wrist watch.

There are thousands more photographs in physical and digital form that make up my stack of MG images. It can be absorbingly illuminating fun to visit the cars, things, friends and places that our past selves valued, enjoyed and documented.

Under the Bonnett

The Mystery of the 3rd Gear Killer By Ann Plasschaert, Mark Tidwell, Lonnie Cook ... and Gemini Al

Picture this: Ann Plasschaert, confidently shifting her TF into third gear, ascending the 17/92 interchange over 436. Suddenly, the engine falters, power vanishes, and she finds herself in a nightmare situation - coasting backwards into traffic. Miraculously, she missed the oncoming cars, and the TF revived after a wait, but the killer returned on her journey home as she shifted into third.

Mark Tidwell and I investigated. Everything seemed perfect: engine mount, points, timing, wiring, valve train, exhaust, fuel flow, fuel filters, carbs. The engine idled flawlessly during our tests. We were baffled. So, Mark and Ann embarked on a test drive. "It sputtered and died as Ann shifted into third," Mark recounted, a hint of bewilderment in his voice. "We managed to limp back." The mystery deepened.

Then, a breakthrough! As Ann pulled into the garage, a wisp of steam caught our attention. Lifting the bonnet, we discovered the spark plugs and distributor drenched in water and antifreeze. A hidden split on the underside of the upper radiator hose was the culprit. It crumbled in Mark's hands as he removed it. The "M.O.": The car ran flawlessly when cold. However, as the engine warmed, approximately the time it took to reach third gear, the rising water pressure pushed coolant out of the damaged hose, short-circuiting the spark plugs and distributor to kill the engine. Once the engine cooled and the water evaporated, the car would restart – albeit temporarily.

Redemption: We installed a spare hose. Ann confirmed no leaks, no stalls. However, mindful of their age, we returned the following week to replace the three lower radiator hoses. Now, for those unfamiliar with the TF's engine bay, let's just say it's a tight squeeze requiring the dexterity of a seasoned surgeon (Mark), or a person with hands the size of a 6 year-old (Lonnie). After a couple of hours of strategic cussing, and contortion, the hoses were replaced.

Like all MG enthusiasts, a few scrapes and grease-stained hands were our badges of honor for a task completed.

Extraordinary Provenance - Extraordinary Car: One family 1950 MG TD For Sale MG TD car #2932 was purchased new from International Motors NYC by Blair Engle's father, a member of the Westchester Sports Car Club. Blair became an MG fanatic at an early age and proudly took custody of the TD in 1962. A graduate Engineer, Blair was a founding member of the Classic MG Club and of MG Vintage Racers; #199 in the New England MG 'T' Register. While serving as the engineer in charge of the FSU Physics Lab, he operated The Classic MG Shop in Tallahassee. A Moss Motors Distributor since the 1970's, he performed the exacting restoration of the TD with NOS parts and accessories, which now, if available at all, are only reproductions. The engine was upgraded to TD MkII specs with dual fuel pumps, large valves and 1-1/2" carbs, resulting in outstanding performance. For the last 50 years, the car has been kept in an air conditioned garage, driven and shown periodically by Blair's son Craig. The TD's lacquer paint has minor flaws, and the power unit has the usual slight leaks. The car presents beautifully, enhanced by the correct period accessories.


