


Watkins Glen Festival 2024

MG is a big part of the racing history at Watkins Glen, with MGTCs finishing in 8 of the top 10 finishing positions in the inaugural 1948 Grand Prix. The Festival has honored MG in 1994, 2004, 2014, and will again in 2024. There will be an MG-only car show and dinner on Thursday and a Tour De Marque on Friday, beginning at a winery and including laps on the current Watkins Glen International race track and two laps on the old street course. 

Labor Day weekend was filled with MGs and activities in northern Connecticut at Lime Rock Park. CMGC was there – twelve members and five MGs. The place is truly a park, not like any other race track. Surrounded by mountaintops and covered in grasses and trees, the beauty is not spoiled by any grandstands. Located in the Berkshire Mountains, this area has been a summer retreat for over a century.

The 5-day weekend was filled with events. Thursday afternoon, there was a 20-mile parade on back roads and through small towns, ending in the tiny town of Falls Village where a street festival was being held to honor the sports and racing cars. Crossroads were blocked and people lined the roads, cheering as cars passed. In the paddock, there was an MG 100 display with a range of MG models lined up, from a 1925 Super Sports, a J4, two MGAs that raced at Sebring, and a TC that raced the street course at Watkins Glen.

Practice, qualifying, and races were held on Friday, Saturday, and Monday. There is no racing on Sunday due to a noise ordinance. However, Sunday is a grand day at Lime Rock. A car show is set up around the entire race track with many marques represented and an invitation-only Concours on the front straight.

With MG as the honored marque, there were two Concour classes – race cars and street cars. Robert Carr and Holly Bird's beautiful J2 won the second-place ribbon in the street car MG class It was a wonderful weekend, with beautiful weather, filled with activities and people to meet. 

This postcard is from Canterbury, Kent with a photo of the Maltby's Motor Engineers building on New dover Road. The car on the left in an MG 18/80. A little bit of Googling reveals that the name may have been a reference to Maltby's coach building activities on, mainly, Wolseley chassis from the Morris organization at their Sandgate, Kent location. This particular building was converted to a fire station in the 1930's. And interestingly, Lt. Cmdr. 
