
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President's Thoughts

October Meeting Notes

Mike McCormick called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Dodie Beach reported that the bank account gained 5 cents in interest.

The following new members introduced themselves: Dan Phillips lives in Kissimmee and owns a '79 Midget. Paul and Kristine Dobson live in Orlando and own a 1962 MGA 1600. Jim Ireland lives in Longwood and owns a 1952 red TD with his friend Chris Chernus. Joel Theard hosted some members of the club before the meeting outside his beautiful Lakeshore Drive home with his black '57 MGA on display.

Old Business

Patrick Raley reported that the attendees at the Lunch and Darts event at Fiddler's on the Green enjoyed great food, drinks, and darts.

Mike McCormick reminded the members that the Saturday **Avon Park Overnighter** participants need to contact either John Camichos or Mark Tidwell, depending on whether they are leaving from Orlando or Clermont. Mark Tidwell passed out maps of our route to members leaving from Clermont.

The large 40+ group present had a spirited discussion of the possibility of weekend daylight meetings rather than a third Thursday evening. The large room with poor acoustics made for a rather chaotic conversation at times, but important points were made. Lonnie Cook gave some history of our MG Club founded in 1963 by young men in their late 20's interested in MGs. He suggested we should honor these founders and our new members by focusing on our cars during the daylight rather than at dinner meetings in dark, crowded parking lots. He also mentioned that in Florida, Thursday night 7-9 PM has the highest rates of traffic deaths and Saturday/Sunday mornings the least. Doug Rothwell said that other British clubs also meet on weekends so we should try to avoid overlap with their meetings. Nancy Payne thought that finding a private room for a breakfast meeting is a lot easier than finding a free meeting room at dinner time. Robin Messina repeated her oft-made request of the past that the club have meetings in at least three different locales in Central Florida so our far-flung club gives everyone some access. John Avallone said that there are many variables involved in the meeting location decision and that it should not be made from a vote of those present at tonight's meeting, as was suggested. He later promised that he would research how other clubs are handling their meeting places. Mike McCormick suggested that we could post a ballot in the Octagon and have the membership who attend meetings vote yea or nay on weekend meetings via email once we establish some viable options for weekends. Patrick Raley voiced how much the club enjoys the social aspect of dinner out, and that it works better for those in the club who are not retired. Dodie asked for volunteers for a committee to research the possible change and the following volunteered: Lonnie Cook, Scott Buie, John Avallone, Mark Tidwell, Richard Dweyer, Mike McCormick.

New Business

Mike McCormick announced that Brian and Jack Collins had emailed and posted online today about a Saturday, Nov 6 **Cars and Coffee** to be held at Ceres Motorsports from 9 AM until noon.

Scott Buie, Lonnie Cook and Mike McCormick encouraged attendance at the Saturday, November 13th **organizational meeting for our April GOF**. Bill Dixon has been working on getting sponsors for the GOF and encouraged all members to think of contacts they may have that would want to sponsor and advertise at our event. Ann Plasschaert would like us to meet at her house at 6 PM before the **Paul Plasschaert Memorial Tour of Lights.** We will leave at 6:30 on the Tour led by her son Jeff and finish at 7:30 for dinner. Ann has made arrangements at the nearby Outback Restaurant after the Tour for those who wish to participate. She will need a headcount closer to the event. Mike McCormick said that the Tour and Dinner would officially be our Christmas event this year.

The meeting adjourned at 7:59.




A Postcard from Karel & A Greeting Card from Reinout

The card was produced by the UK-based MGC Register and sponsored by the Bromsgrove MG Centre (which, I think, no longer exists). I sent the card to my Dutch MGC friend, Rob Weijers, in December of last year, shortly before he sadly passed away. Rob loved his MGC.


