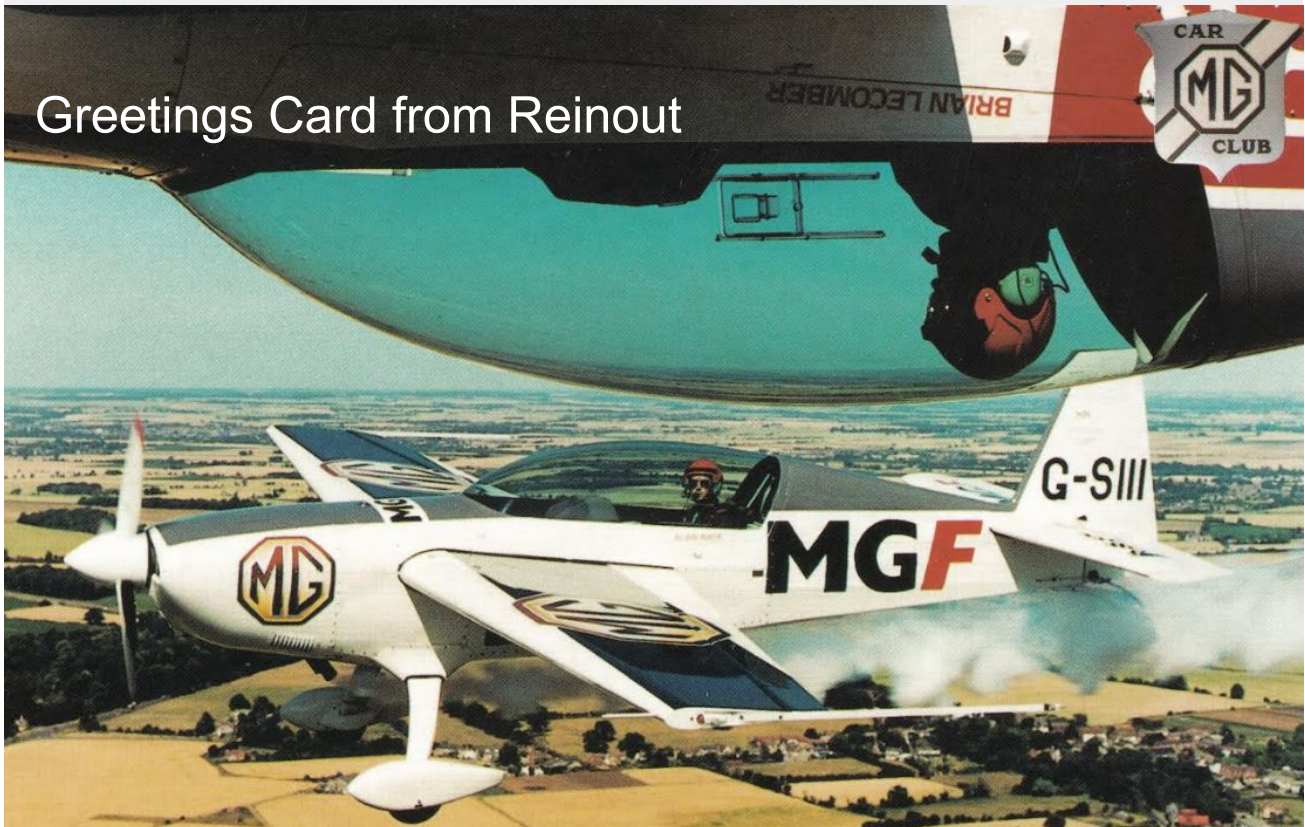

## Tech Session in Detail



On March 27, Mark Tidwell held a Tech session on “Detailing his red MG TC 825”. The session was well attended by 6 members. The goals were to show how to properly detail and maintain your MG and to familiarize the attendees with the equipment and products needed to accomplish these tasks.

The car areas covered were aluminum, chrome, brass, rubber, vinyl, paint and glass. The group was shown how to polish metal parts, and maintain their appearance. An in-depth discussion of paint care was covered; washing, spot removal, compounding, polishing and sealing.

The group was shown how to maintain the show ready appearance with very little effort.

Upon conclusion of the tech session, the group went to lunch at the Clermont Oyster Bar.

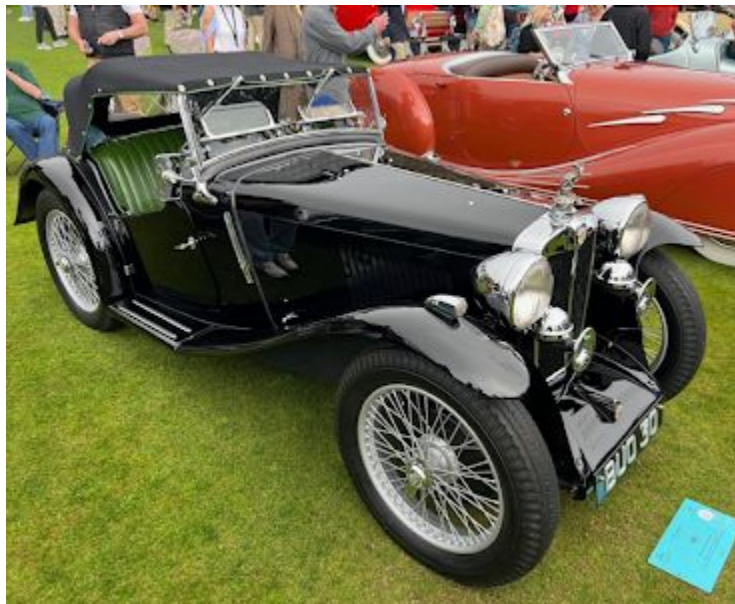

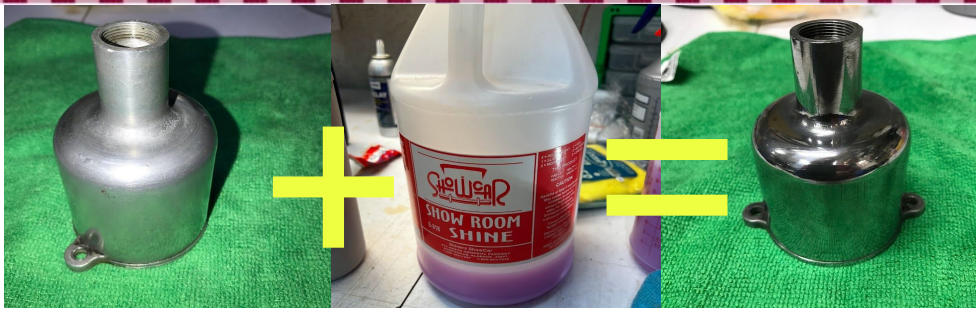

# From Under the Bonnett

*"The solution to detailing is using the right solution"*

## Paint Care Tips Shared at Mark's Tech Session:

- Most Important, keep your car covered when not in use!
- Car wash: use any 'car' soap , but just a few ounces, clean water, microfiber towels, light pressure, and frequent rinsing.
- Drying: a leaf blower first to blow off excess water followed by a shammy (chamois cloth).
- If the car does not have a lot of dust, dirt or sand, use a cleaner/wax product like Showroom Shine. Spray it on, wipe it off with a microfiber, then buff with dry microfiber. This minimizes the need for washing and your paint has fresh coat of wax/sealant.
- If there are scratches and oxidized paint over a large surface, then you will need to polish the paint. This grinds off a layer of your paint, so take as little of it as you need to restore the appearance.
- Polishing the paint, (it's different than waxing). It uses compounds that are divided by coarseness of the abrasive. From most to least are rubbing compound , polishing compound , ultrafine polishing compound.
- Once the paint has been polished it should be sealed with a wax, polymer, or ceramic coat.
- Spots on the paint? First, use soap and water if not successful, then mineral spirits, if that doesn't work, then you may need abrasives. A clay preparation can be used as this is the mildest of the abrasives

"There are a number of paint types. Older ones are lacquer, enamel, and urethane (Imron, Amerflint). The entire thickness of these paints have pigment. Modern paints are two layered, usually water-based. Their base coat is the pigmented layer and by itself, has a flat finish. A clear coat covers the base coat and adds depth and shine to enhance the appearance. Normally paint is about 4-7 mil thick. The goal in maintaining the appearance of the paint is to preserve the thickness of that paint layer."
