

John Spadaro can give us updates on whether the North will meet with the South again, so we did not put this in the schedule.


We also hope to plan a tech session with a date to be determined. This can be a subject discussed at our next club meeting.





It Is a Small MG World by Glen Moore

Jill and I were in the hotel lobby at Silverstone England when we saw a guy with a red jacket filled with MG patches. Interesting. So, I took a few steps to get a closer look and one patch on his back jumped out at me – the early Classic MG Club of Orlando patch. The one John Camichos designed.

Introduced myself and learned that I was talking to Norm Ewing from South Africa. How does South Africa and the Classic MG Club intersect? Norm enthusiastically shared the story with me.

He got the patch in 1982. Tony Roth, a long-time CMGC member and vintage racer, gave it to him. Norm was making a tour of the United States, bringing along 38 South African MG enthusiasts with him. One of the group's first stops was at GOF South 1982 in Melbourne. Norm tells the story that 400 American MG enthusiasts showed up, from across the country, including Oklahoma and California, and treated them royally. He has many fond memories flashback through his mind every time he sees that patch



A break for a little CMGC and GOF history. Dr. Jerry Kueper was an MG enthusiast who owned multiple prewar MGs. He began the MG Car Club of Florida in Jacksonville in 1956. Later he moved to Melbourne to develop Florida Institute of Technology. The MG Car Club moved with him. In 1982, he hosted the GOF South on the college campus, opening up the dorms for participant housing. Norm Ewing's group of South African MG enthusiasts were guests.



Now, this was not Norm's first big MG adventure. In 1970, he began his honeymoon trip in a 1957 MGA roadster with his wife Pat, 5 months pregnant. They did make it around the world, stopping in England for the birth of their daughter. They logged 26,000 miles in the MGA and 35,000 miles on two ships. It was a year-long honeymoon.





In 1986, Norm was back in the United States to join the New England MG 'T' Register for the "Ocean-to-Ocean T Tourist Tour" celebrating 50 years of the MG T series. Fifty MGs drove from New York to Santa Barbara then returning east to Toronto. They made the journey in 18 days.

These are just a couple of Norm's MG adventures. He has joined many MG events around the globe and created many himself. Norm lands very high on the MG enthusiast scale.

For those members who felt that Gainesville was too far to drive an MG to attend the GOF, you need to spend some time talking with Norm.


