



GOF South

As we celebrate our 60th year, it is time to look back on our club's history, the events, the accomplishments, and the good times. There are reasons the club has been successful for 60 years.

The most important accomplishment has been the GOF South. It is the largest MG event in the southeast US, the most important, and the greatest contribution to the MG community.



"Gathering of the Faithful" was coined by the leadership of the New England MG 'T' Register as they planned an event to bring MG owners together to share their enthusiasm for the marque. The first GOF was held in the fall of 1965, in Meredith, NH. It was a success and gained the attention of MG clubs nationwide.

CMGC club members found the idea of the GOF appealing. They wanted to bring the GOF experience to MG owners in the south, so they invested their time and talents to create the Gathering of the Faithful South. The first GOF South was organized by our club, held in St. Cloud, in 1967. That first GOF South was an event in partnership with NEMGTR, planned and managed by the Classic MG Club of Orlando. After a few years, the GOF South became an independent activity of our club.

GOF South MK1 included a meet & greet, a car show, technical sessions, drives, social events, and a banquet. It was a huge success! It became known throughout the country. The 1973 GOF South presented the long-distance award to a couple who drove their MGTC from Massachusetts to attend. The program of events has changed little as GOF South continued through the years, a testimony to the great planning of the original committee.



In later years, after new MG clubs were established around the state of Florida, other clubs stepped up to help host the GOF South. At one point, three different MG clubs rotated the hosting of the event. CMGC hosted the event once every three years. Currently, the organizational responsibilities are shared between two clubs – CMGC and the MG Classics Club of Jacksonville.

GOF South MK57 will be hosted by

the Jacksonville club, at the Best Western Gateway Grand, Gainesville, April 20-23. As always, it will be the most important MG event in the southeast US. It will offer a full slate of MG activities providing attendees opportunities to learn more about their MGs, enjoy driving their MGs, and meet other MG enthusiasts. GOF South 2024 will be the responsibility of the Classic MG Club of Orlando. The location of the 2024 event will be announced soon.






A Postcard from Karel & A Greeting Card from Reinout




