

MMM Register Regional Joins GOF South 2024

The North American MMM Register was created to provide a means of communication among owners of MMM cars in North America. It was founded by Jerry Kueper, a Floridian who provided much leadership to the MG community. (MMM refers to Midget, Magna and Magnette: the overhead cam MGs produced between 1929 and 1936.) For the first time, the MMM Register has decided to hold a Regional event for their members, joining the GOF South 2024 in Crystal River.

The Classic MG Club of Orlando welcomes the Triple M cars and members and looks forward to the excitement and history added to the show field. These pre-war MGs are very active worldwide. At Silverstone Circuit this summer, 27 MMM cars competed on the racetrack. In Holland, the MG 100 MMM was attended by over 40 cars. Many drives were held, with Triple M owners taking their cars on twisty, and sometimes gravel roads. One celebration at the event was to organize the cars into the logo of the event – MG 100. 
Postcards from Karel



Karel was on vacation in Saint-Raphaël in the Côte d'Azur area in the Southeastern part of France on the Mediterranean coast. Instead of a postcard, he sent this historical photo of the winners of the 1938 edition of the Paris-St. Raphaël Feminine Rally, Betty Haig and co-driver Barbara Marshall.

The MG is a 1936 PB (Chassis number PB0532)

Greeting Card from Reinout



Along the lines of Karel's rally PB, here is a card of a PB that was used in the 1930's Trials in England. The car, driven by Maurice Toulmin, is one of the Cream Crackers Team cars. The artwork is by Tom Wait and is copywrited to Alternative Cards Ltd., the same as last Month's MGB.

The origin of the Cream Crackers name is detailed in the book The Works MG's by Mike Allison and Peter Browning. Mike Allison is a well known prewar MG historian, ex MG employee, and founding member and President of the UK based Triple-M Register of the MG Car Club. Here follows that section of the book. "John Thornely told me this story many years ago, which I repeat here, chiefly because Jack Bastock told me that he was present on the occasion. It is generally thought that Kimber decided that the cars would be cream with brown wings, like the racing cars. The fact that cars were privately owned and that the owners might not have taken kindly to having their cars sprayed a Works' color was not really discussed. However it seems that the paint foreman of the time (RV: 1934 when the three team members, Toulmin, MacDermid, and Bastock ordered their first trial-competition cars) assumed that the cards were MG Works cars, and, having no other orders, painted the in the same scheme as the 1934 K3's of the Eyston team. The finished cars were lined up outside Service waiting to be picked up by their owners. When Toulmin arrived he exclaimed that they looked 'real little crackers'. MacDermid liked this idea and labelled them Cream Crackers,... 'because they are cream', and the name stuck. One wonders if a well-known biscuit manufacturer was approached for sponsorship, but this is very unlikely, since ideas of that type did not occur in 1935.

From Under the Bonnett

Quickly adjust valves on ANY MG

Our friend John Twist of University Motors is at it again!

It's the remake of a video he made years ago, where he offers an understanding of an easier approach to valve adjustment on your MG.

Points made:

- Before adjusting the valves, torque the heads!
 Torque the Cylinder Head on MG video
- You can adjust the valves on a hot or cold engine
- Adjust a valve when its partner valve opens (the spring is tight),
 e.g., 8 opens adjust 1 Hint, they all add to 9. 1-8, 2-7, 3-6, 4-5, etc.
- You can adjust 2 valves at a time, just look for the tight springs
- Snug your valves with a consistent feel
- Seat the gasket to the valve cover before placing it on the head.
