





Since the club's inception 61 years ago, the club has held monthly meetings at an evening dinner setting and organized a driving activity every month, two being overnighters. An expansion of activities began this year with the institution of Pop-Up Events, gatherings that could be announced by any member, inviting others to join in. The first Pop-Up happened in January when Mark Tidwell asked members to join him at the Roar Before the 24, the warm-up to the Rolex 24 Hours at Daytona.

A change this year was that two of the club meetings were held on Saturday mornings along with a breakfast meal. One result was that many more MGs were driven to the meetings than daily drivers.

The spring overnighter was to the historic Hotel Jacaranda, in Avon Park. Drives from multiple directions converged at the old-time Frostbite Restaurant for lunch, then headed to the Hotel Jacaranda in an MG convoy. The drive home included a visit to the intriguing Singing Tower at Bok Tower Gardens, Lake Wales. The fall overnighter was to Marjoric Kinnan Rawlings State Park where the park ranger led the group on a tour of the Pulitzer Prize-winning author's home and grounds. Lunch at the Yearling Restaurant (named after that book) for real southern cooking was followed by a visit to Micanopy, the oldest inland town in Florida.

Other weekend activities included the Morse Museum (the largest collection of Tiffany glass and other works) in Winter Park, an airboat ride on Lake Panasofkee, the North/South picnic in Travares, a drive and lunch along the Indian River, a visit to the Lakeridge Winery & Vineyards during a special event with live music, Longwood Mansion Museum tour, and a visit to Harry P. Leu Gardens with an outstanding interpretation by a staff member.

The traditional November picnic, held for decades at a member's horse farm, was updated and named the Founders Picnic, in honor of the founding members of the club. The new location is in DeLand at a park on the St. Johns River. It was one of the biggest events of the year with perfect British gray and damp weather. December ended the year with the Tour of Lights, driving decorated MGs through the Christmas-lighted streets in Winter Park, followed by dinner at the tennis club.

Tech sessions were popular, topics including general tune-up, tips and methods of fine detailing of an MG, and the most exciting – starting a 1500 XPEG built by club founder and racer, Blair Engle. He built the engine 35 years earlier and it had never been cranked. The George Pardee-led session resulted in the engine firing up almost instantly.

Of course, the most important and largest event was GoF South. The Classic MG Club of Orlando and the MG Classics of Jacksonville share the responsibility for this event on a rotating basis. The Orlando Club served as host for GoF South 2024. The

Plantation Resort in Crystal River was the chosen hotel and site for most of the activities. Multiple drives were offered; one, The Tail of the Gator, is claimed to be the curviest road in Florida. Attendees dressed in their finest tweed attire for the Tweed Drive, enjoying an outstanding dinner and camaraderie at a fine dining restaurant. Best of Show was earned by the recently restored MGTC of Ben Gilbert, Sr., and Ben Gilbert, Jr.

Yes, there will be a driving event in January for club members in their MGs – a drive to the historic Richloam General Store ending at Friar Tuck's British Restaurant in Clermont.

Extraordinary Provenance - Extraordinary Car: One family 1950 MG TD For Sale MG TD car #2932 was purchased new from International Motors NYC by Blair Engle's father, a member of the Westchester Sports Car Club. Blair became an MG fanatic at an early age and proudly took custody of the TD in 1962. A graduate Engineer, Blair was a founding member of the Classic MG Club and of MG Vintage Racers; #199 in the New England MG 'T' Register. While serving as the engineer in charge of the FSU Physics Lab, he operated The Classic MG Shop in Tallahassee. A Moss Motors Distributor since the 1970's, he performed the exacting restoration of the TD with NOS parts and accessories, which now, if available at all, are only reproductions. The TD's lacquer paint has minor flaws, and the power unit has the usual slight leaks. The car presents beautifully, enhanced by the correct period accessories.
